

Privacy Policy by using ELAN

The Max-Planck-Gesellschaft zur Förderung der Wissenschaften e.V., here represented by the managing director of the Max Planck Institute for Psycholinguistics, located at Wundtlaan 1 in Nijmegen, Netherlands (hereinafter: "MPI") takes the protection of your personal data very seriously. Here we provide you with information concerning the main aspects of data processing in the context of the ELAN Tool (hereinafter: "ELAN") regarding to the General Data Protection Regulation (hereinafter: "GDPR").

3. Purpose and legal basis of data processing

MPI has built ELAN for the purpose of the public as a transcription tool to add an unlimited number of textual annotations to audio and/or video recordings. As far as required, MPI processes personal data of users for the purpose of providing the ELAN tool (Hereinafter: "ELAN") in a functional manner.

a) Website and Download of ELAN

The data processing serves, as far as the visit of the website is concerned, the functional presentation of the website. The data protection information provided for visiting the website can be found here:

i) Type of processed data

If you download ELAN, your IP address will be collected during the download.

ii) Legal Base

The legal basis for the processing of the IP address for the aforementioned purpose is Art. 6 para. 1 lit. f GDPR. The data processing is essential to enable the download functionally. Our justified interest in data processing also lies in such purposes.

iii) Erasure of the data

The data will be deleted as soon as it is no longer required to fulfil the purpose for which it was collected. If you download ELAN, your IP address will be processed for the duration of the action/download for the purpose of enabling the download and deleted according to A.1.c of the MPI Data Protection Information (<https://www.mpi.nl/page/privacy-policy>).

b) Online web services

ELAN does offer access to online web service providers that any User may choose to use within the tool. Users can trigger the upload of media files or annotations to a web service for automated processing. If you select one of the online web services, the MPI won't process, within the meaning of Art . 4 para. 2 GDPR, intermediately any personal data regarding to the Upload of audio or video records and annotations. The following online web service providers are offered:

WebLicht

- i) Type of processed data
By starting WebLicht your IP-address will be collected as technical manner as well as annotations for processing.

- ii) Legal Base

When you select WebLicht and upload the annotations, you are carrying out the processing of possibly personal data to the service provider of WebLicht. The service provider processes the uploaded personal data on your behalf by clicking WebLicht. Further information about the Processor:

- o Type: webservice orchestration and execution environment
- o Runs: on a server of Sfs Tübingen (<https://weblicht.sfs.uni-tuebingen.de>)
- o Software by: Sfs Tübingen (Seminar für Sprachwissenschaft, Eberhard Karls Universität Tübingen)
- o Accepts: plain text and XML

WebMAUS

- i) Type of processed data
By selecting WebMAUS your IP-address will be collected as technical manner as well as the audio recordings including recordings about natural persons, and optionally annotations.

- ii) Legal Base
When you select WebMAUS and upload the media file, you are carrying out the processing of personal data to the service provider of WebMAUS. The service provider processes the uploaded personal data on your behalf by clicking WebMAUS Further information about the Processor:
 - o Type: webservice
 - o Runs: on a server of the Bavarian Archive for Speech Signals (<https://clarin.phonetik.uni-muenchen.de/BASWebServices/interface>)
 - o Software by: Bavarian Archive for Speech Signals
 - o Accepts: audio and plain text transcript

By using this web service provider, the data protection information provided for using WebMAUS then applies. It can be found here:

Furthermore, ELAN offers Recognizers that are local recognizers which process data locally on the Users computer, where ELAN is installed. By using these local recognizers neither MPI nor any online web service provider does process personal data.

4. Data recipients and categories of data recipients

Regarding to the Online web services, the above under point 3 applies. No data will be transferred to any other third parties than to the ones mentioned above.

5. Your rights

You are fundamentally entitled to the rights of access (Article 15 GDPR), rectification (Article 16 GDPR), erasure (Article 17, para. 1 GDPR), restriction of processing (Article 18 GDPR), data portability (Article 20 GDPR) and withdrawal of consent (Article 7, para. 3 GDPR).
